The Virginia Military Institute Board of Visitors is conducting a meeting on 27 to 29 April 2023, from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. at the Virginia Military Institute in Lexington, Virginia. Virginia Military Institute business will be discussed by the members in attendance. The meeting is open to the public.

Note: The Virginia Military Institute Board of Visitors is expected to take action on tuition and mandatory fees for all cadets at its 29 April 2023 meeting.

- For both in-state and out-of-state cadets, the Board will consider tuition increases ranging from 0% to 4.0%.
- The Board will consider fee increases, which support a mix of academic and non-academic support services, between 0% and 3.0% for all cadets.

Revenue generated from tuition and fee increases, in combination with other revenues and reallocated funds, will likely be used to address personnel costs, including the Institute's share of state mandated salary, fringe benefits, and health insurance changes, enhancements to academic programs, and other institutional initiatives.

Section 23.1-307 (D) of the Code of Virginia requires that 30 days prior to approval of each year's tuition and mandatory fees, the Boards of Visitors of Virginia's higher education institutions announce the range of increases under consideration and the proposed use of any incremental revenue.

Public Comment: The public can sign up to speak during the 29 April 2023 public comment period by contacting LTC Kevin Ryan at ryanka@vmi.edu or (540) 464-7132 prior to 4:30 p.m. on 27 April 2023. Each speaker is limited to three minutes. A written copy of remarks is requested, but not required. Anyone who has not signed up to speak by the deadline may sign-in at the public comment session and, if time permits, will be given an opportunity to speak.

Written comments may also be submitted up until 4:30 p.m. on 27 April 2023. Copies of public comments will be provided to all Board members for review prior to any decision regarding tuition and fees.

Finally, Board members will not provide comment, feedback or answer questions; however, every comment will be heard and considered.
