# VMI Deaths in World War II

The information in the three lists that follow was researched in the VMI Archives and war-era issues of the Alumni Review and compiled by Kathryn Wise, editor of the Review, who determined that 183 alumni died during World War II while in service to their country or while enlisted in the armed forces of America's allies. Alumni are requested to send any omissions or corrections to the VMI Alumni Review.

The plaques shown are located in VMI's Memorial Gardens.

## Class of 1902

#### Maj. Gen. William P. Upshur, USMC

Upshur, his aide and four other men were killed in an airplane crash near Sitka, Alaska, on July 21, 1943. At the time of his death he was commanding general of the U.S. Marines, Pacific, and the senior major general in the U.S. Marine Corps. Upshur had been awarded the Medal of Honor for gallantry during the Haitian Campaign in 1915.

## Class of 1906

#### Lt. Gen. Simon Bolivar Buckner, Jr., USA

Killed in action on June 18, 1945, on Okinawa while commanding the Tenth U.S. Army. Buckner died instantly on the front lines when he was hit by a Japanese shell while observing an attack by the Marine 8th Regimental Combat Team. He was the first U.S. Army commander in chief to be killed in World War II.

## Class of 1907

#### Gen. George S. Patton, USA

Patton, the commander of the Seventh Army and the Third Army, died on Dec. 21, 1945, in Heidelberg, Germany, following injuries received 12 days before in an automobile accident.

## Class of 1910

## Col. Kenna Granville Eastham, USA

Died on April 20, 1944, of a heart attack at Camp Shanks, New York, an installation of the New York Port of Embarkation. He had been its commanding officer since the camp's opening on Jan. 4, 1943; he was previously commanding officer of the Brooklyn Army Base, and had been commanding officer of a pioneer infantry battalion in the Verdun area.

# 1Sgt. George T. Burdeau, Jr., USAAF

Died in Italy on July 18, 1944, of a heart attack. Burdeau was a Regular Army cavalry first lieutenant in World War I.

# Class of 1914

#### Maj. William Val Sanford, USA

A physician and a member of the Army's Medical Corps, he died of a heart attack on Dec. 5, 1943, while on duty in Italy.

### Class of 1917

#### Lt. Col. Joseph G. Ward, USMC

Executive officer of Marine Barracks, Norfolk Naval Operating Base, he died at the Naval hospital in Portsmouth, Virginia, on Oct. 22, 1944.

## Class of 1919

### Maj. Stuart W. King, USMC

Killed in action on Dec. 31, 1944, as a result of the bombing of a Japanese prison ship en route from The Philippines to Japan.

### Lt. Col. Edward W. Thomson, USAAF

Killed in action in an airplane crash in Burma on May 30, 1945.

## Class of 1920

#### Brig. Gen. Charles L. Keerans, Jr., USA

Missing in action in the airborne phase of the invasion of Sicily on July 11, 1943; declared killed in action on July 12, 1944.

#### Lt. Col. William T. S. Roberts, USA

The commander of a combat command of the 10th Armored Division, he was killed in action in Germany on April 9, 1945.

## Class of 1921

#### Lt. Col. John M. Ribble, USA

Died on June 23, 1945, of a heart attack at his home near Markham, Virginia.

#### Maj. Samuel A. Syme, USA

Died on Jan. 2, 1944, in Algiers while on a mission as a member of the staff of Gen. George S. Patton '07.

#### Class of 1922

### Lt. Col. Samuel D. Puller, USMC

Killed in action in the Pacific on July 28, 1944.

### Class of 1923

#### Maj. Seale Harris, Jr., USA

Died in Brisbane, Australia, on Dec. 22, 1943.

## Class of 1924

#### Lt. George C. Willcox, USN

Died on July 2, 1943, in an airplane crash.

## Class of 1925


#### 1Lt. William R. Williams, USA

Killed in action on Jan. 15, 1945, on a Japanese prison ship near Formosa.

#### Class of 1926

#### Lt. Col. Cornelius Z. Byrd, USA

Captured on Bataan in March 1942 and died in a Japanese prison camp on Mar. 1, 1945.

Maj. Joseph B. Coopwood, USA Killed in action in Italy on Nov. 21, 1943.

## Lt. James N. Jones, USN

Died of sleeping sickness at Fort Bragg on Aug. 14, 1941.

#### Bailey M. Sawyer, RAAF

A Royal Australian Air Force pilot officer, he died on Jan. 28, 1941, in an airplane crash at Parks, New South Wales.

#### Cpl. Franklin F. Smith, USAAF

Died on June 14, 1943, in the Southwest Pacific in an airplane accident.

## Class of 1928

#### Capt. Thomas P. Fullilove, USA

Stationed at Camp Claiborne, Louisiana, he was found dead in a woods near Goss, Louisiana, on Oct. 2, 1943. He had been missing since Sept. 19, 1943.

# Li Jen-Tao '28, Chinese Army

During World War II Li was the commander of the Nationalist Army Chemical Warfare Service. He died in 1944 in a plane crash over the Hump in Burma.

## Class of 1929

### Lt. Col. George F. Miller, USA

Killed in action in Germany on Jan. 20, 1945.

# The Rev. William Byrd Lee Milton, RAF

Milton and his brother, the Rev. Marshall M. Milton, Jr. '34, took leaves of absence from their churches when World War II began and joined the Royal Air Force, first going to Canada and then to the ferry command in England. Milton died in a plane crash in Scotland in 1943 while serving as a flight officer with the Air Transport Auxiliary. Together, the brothers were known as "Virginia's Famed Flying Parsons." Marshall Milton died on Nov. 5, 1993.

## 1Lt. John V. Summerlin, USA

Died on Jan. 21, 1943.

# John A. Woodall, Canadian Army

An airplane ferry pilot, he drowned on April 29, 1941, when the British liner *Nerissa* was sunk off the coast of Ireland by a German pocket-battleship, submarine and airplane attack.

#### 1Lt. Lawrence C. Blanchard, Jr., USA

Killed in action in France on June 8, 1944.

### Capt. Louis G. Chadwick, USA

Died of a heart attack at Camp Blanding, Florida, on Sept. 15, 1942.

#### Douglas M. Clarke, Canadian Army

A member of the Canadian Army, he was reported missing in action. His date of death is unknown.

# Cpl. Edgar Marshall Dickerson, French Foreign Legion

Reported missing in action after the battle of Himeimat Ridge in the early part of Gen. Sir Bernard L. Montgomery's offensive at El Alamein in North Africa on Oct. 30, 1942.

## Pvt. Tom P. Edwards, USAAF

Drowned on July 18, 1942, while stationed at Keesler Field, Mississippi.

# Noel M. Moore, Jr., RCAF

A pilot in the Royal Canadian Air Force, he was killed in action on July 1, 1942.

## Capt. J. Rivers Adams, USMC

Killed in action on Guam on July 21, 1944.

# 1Lt. J. Randolph T. Carmichael, USA

Died on Aug. 28, 1941.

# Capt. Walter A. Ford, Jr., USA

Killed by an explosion near Seybruck, Germany, on May 12, 1945.

# 1Lt. Robert O. Garrett, Jr., USN

Died on Feb. 14, 1943, after an illness which resulted from being thrown from his horse in Feb. 1942 while with the U.S. Cavalry at Fort Meyer.

# Maj. Charles F. Harrison, Jr., USA

A prisoner of war, he was killed by the Japanese while attempting to escape on May 22, 1944.

### Maj. Alexander C. Newton, USA

A member of the 4th Armored Division, he was killed in action on July 29, 1944, at Cantepie, France.

# Lt. E. Dunston Romm, USN

Killed in action on board the USS Cooper when she sank on Dec. 3, 1944, off Leyte, The Philippines. Killed at the same time was Lt(j.g.) Belton A. Bennett, Jr. '34.

# Lt. Joseph W. Stirni, USCG

Captured by Japanese forces in 1941 and killed by an American bomb dropped on Formosa on Jan. 9, 1945.

### Capt. James C. Gilliland, USAAF

Killed on July 10, 1945, in an airplane crash over Tarawa in the Gilbert Islands.

## Capt. Henry C. Hudgins, USA

Killed in action in Austria on May 5, 1945.

## T/Sgt. Valentine B. Lawless, USAF

Shot down near Linz, Austria, on Oct. 16, 1944.

# Maj. Arthur W. Marklis, USA

Killed in action in France on Aug. 1, 1944.

# Capt. W. Norris Mason, Jr., USA

Killed in action in Italy on Dec. 20, 1943.


Killed in action on Feb. 11, 1945, in Luzon, The Philippines.

Killed on Dec. 31, 1942, in the Southwest Pacific.

#### 1Lt. Addison W. Palmer, Jr., USA

Killed in a plane crash on Sept. 27, 1944, on Biak Island.

#### Lt. Col. Eugene R. Venable, USA

Killed in action in an airplane crash in Prestwick, Scotland, on Aug. 27, 1944.

#### 1Lt. John J. Ward, Jr., USMC

Killed in action on Tinian Island on July 24, 1944.

#### Maj. William W. Emory, USA

Killed in action near Sidi Bou Zid, Tunisia, on Feb. 15, 1943.

#### Maj. Carter S. Vaden, USA

Killed in action on Los Negros Island in the Southwest Pacific on Mar. 10, 1944.

### Pfc. Rufus D. King, Jr., USMC

Killed in action on Iwo Jima on Mar. 11, 1945.

#### Cmdr. Beriah Magoffin III, USN

Died on Jan. 29, 1946, when he drowned in the Cooper River in Charleston, South Carolina.

#### Lt. Col. Marcus A. Mullen, USA

Killed in action over Japan on Jan. 4, 1945.

#### Lt. Col. Horatio C. Woodhouse, Jr., USMC

Killed in action by a sniper's bullet on Okinawa on May 30, 1945. He is buried in the Sixth Marine Division Cemetery on Okinawa.

#### Class of 1937

#### 1Lt. Hester C. Cothron, USA

Killed in a jeep accident on Jan. 14, 1943, at Fort Clark, Texas, while stationed at Fort Knox, Kentucky.

## 1Lt. Alfred C. Darden, Jr., USAAF

Died on April 3, 1942, in an airplane crash at the Columbia, South Carolina, air base.

#### 1Lt. John J. McEveety, USA

Killed in action on July 6, 1944, on Saipan.

## 2Lt. Leo E. Ofenstein, USAAF

The first pilot on a B-24 bomber, he was killed in action over France on April 29, 1944.

#### Lt. Col. A. Bruce Pendleton, USAAF

Died on June 3, 1943, in an airplane crash in Ecuador.

#### Maj. I. Harrison Sclater, Jr., USA

Died on Dec. 30, 1944, in a traffic accident in Birmingham, England.

#### Capt. Harold C. Sheffey, USA

A member of the 83rd Infantry Division, he was killed in action in France on July 16, 1944.

### Maj. Joseph X. Bell, USAAF

Killed in action over Germany on Mar. 10, 1945.

#### Lt. Richard Booth, Jr., USA

Killed in action on May 12, 1945, in Germany.

#### 1Lt. Paul L. Borden, Jr., USA

Killed in action in Germany on Feb. 5, 1945.

#### 1Lt. Freeling T. Colt, USA

Killed in action at Normandy, France, on 1944. June 6 (D-Day)

#### Capt. Jesse H. Heath, Jr., USA

Killed in action in Belgium on Jan. 3, 1945.

#### Lt. Col. John A. Shanklin, Jr., USA

Killed in action in Germany on April 8, 1945.

### Lt. Robert L. Sibley, Jr., USA

Killed in action in Sicily on July 13, 1943. His body is interred in a military cemetery in Comisi, Sicily.

### Capt. George M. White, USAAF

Killed in a combat plane crash on Oct. 6, 1942, at Camp Stewart, Georgia, where he was stationed as a pilot in the Army Air Forces, Fighter Command.

#### Lt. Charles C. Arms, USA

Died on Oct. 3, 1943.

### 2Lt. Bernard P. Carter, Jr., USAAF

Killed on June 23, 1942, in the crash of an airplane at a dive bombing exhibition at Lake Valencia, Caracas, Venezuela, when a Venezuelan cadet froze at the controls. Carter was in Venezuela as a combined diplomat and instructor to the Venezuelan Air Force in the use of American planes.

#### Lt(j.g.) William W. Coleman, USN

Killed on June 7, 1943, during an airplane crash at sea in the Pacific.

#### Capt. Joseph H. Fleming III, USA

Killed in an Army Transport plane crash near Calcutta, India, on Sept. 21, 1943.

#### Maj. Frederick A. Hippey, USA

Killed in China on Aug. 6, 1945.

#### Lt. Col. William P. Kevan, Jr., USAAC

The U.S. Air Attaché at Belgrade, Yugoslavia, he was killed in an airplane crash over the Mediterranean on Nov. 27, 1945.

### Capt. Jackson S. Littrell, USAAF

Died on Oct. 27, 1945, in a C-47 plane crash near Pennville, Indiana.

## 1Lt. Robert W. Nix III, USA

Killed in action on June 1, 1944, in Italy.

# AO 2/c William F. Topham, USN

Killed in action on Nov. 24, 1943, in the Pacific.

#### 1Lt. John D. Wilson, USAAF

Killed in action on Feb. 15, 1944, in New Guinea.

## Class of 1940

#### 2Lt. Reid S. Aaron, USA

A Japanese prisoner of war, he was killed in action while being moved from The Philippines on Feb. 15, 1944.

## 2Lt. R. Woodfin Boggess, Jr., USAAF

Killed in action on July 15, 1943, in North Africa.

## Maj. Philip G. Chapman, USAAF

Killed in action Mar. 25, 1945, when the plane he was flying crashed after being damaged by ground fire during a raid on Hong Kong. Chapman was commander of the 23rd Fighter Group of the 14th Air Force. In the seven months he was overseas, he shot down five planes, destroyed 21 on the ground and sank three Japanese vessels.

## Capt. William H. U. Darden, USAAC

Died on Dec. 6, 1943, in a B-24 plane crash in California.

#### 1Lt. Charles J. Faulkner IV, USAAF

Killed in action on Nov. 1, 1944, in a jeep accident at Brou, France.

### Lt(j.g.) Charles B. Fodale, USN

Reported missing in action on the *USS Juneau* after the Battle of the Solomons on Nov. 13, 1942; reported killed in action on July 31, 1943.

# 1Lt. George B. J. Handy, USA

Died on Jan. 23, 1942, in The Philippines.

#### Capt. Joseph D'A. Harris, USA

Died on Feb. 5, 1944, from wounds received in action in Italy.

## 2Lt. William J. Lang, Jr., USAAF

Captured by the Japanese in the Bataan Campaign in May 1942, he was killed en route from Luzon to Japan on a prison ship which was torpedoed by American forces on Oct. 24, 1944.

#### Lt. Malcolm B. MacKinnon, USAAF

The pilot of a flying fortress which was declared missing in action on June 11, 1943, over the North Sea, he was declared dead on June 12, 1944.

### Lt. Nelson E. McCaa, USN

Killed in action on Feb. 17, 1945, when his plane was shot down over the Palaus Island Group in the Pacific.

# Lt. Douglas G. McMillin, USAAF

A navigator on a B-24 declared missing in action in the South Pacific while attacking a Japanese convoy, he was declared killed in action on July 5, 1944.

# Capt. Thomas R. Opie, USAAF

Died on Nov. 10, 1944, in the crash of an Army airplane in New Mexico.

#### Capt. William G. Shultz, AUS

Killed in action in Belgium on Jan. 13, 1945. (Shultz matriculated with the class of '40 and graduated with the class of '41.)

## Lt. James A. Smith III, USN

Killed in action on Nov. 5, 1943.

#### Capt. Sydney A. Vincent, Jr., USA

Killed in action by a mortar shell on July 19, 1944, at Normandy during the Battle of St. Lo; he was with the 803rd Tank Destroyer Battalion, 29th "Blue and Gray" Infantry Division.

#### Capt. Linwood Vinson, Jr., USA

Died on Dec. 23, 1943, at Camp Ibis, California, in an explosion at a demolition demonstration.

### 1Lt. Charles A. Butler, Jr., USAAC

Killed in action in the Mediterranean area on Dec. 18, 1944.

#### 1Lt. Willis J. Dance, Jr., USAAC

Killed in an airplane accident near Harding Field, Louisiana, on Mar. 28, 1943.

### Lt. Charles H. Gompf, USNR

A fighter pilot attached to the aircraft carrier Franklin D. Roosevelt, he was killed at sea on June 21, 1946.

#### 1Lt. Fleming C. Goolsby, USAAC

One of the first American pilots to make the flight over Rouen, France, he was killed on Dec. 26, 1942, when his plane was shot down.

#### 2Lt. Fred B. Hill, AUS

Killed in action in North Africa on Nov. 8, 1942.

#### 1Lt. Gilder S. Horne, Jr., AUS

Declared missing in action at Faid Pass, Tunisia, on Jan. 31, 1943; declared killed in action on Jan. 31, 1944.

#### 1Lt. Victor H. Idol, Jr., USAAC

Reported missing in action on June 17, 1944, over Cherbourg Peninsula; later reported as being last seen parachuting over La Haye de Puits, France; declared killed in action on April 3, 1945. He was a P-47 Thunderbolt pilot.

#### 1Lt. R. Finley Jones, AUS

Killed in action on Luzon on Jan. 17, 1945.

### Capt. Philip H. Killey, AUS

Killed in action near Chouigui Pass, Tunisia, on April 2, 1943.

# 2Lt. Lewis A. Lillard, USAAC

Killed in a bomber crash at Bowen Field, Boise, Idaho, on May 3, 1943. (Lillard matriculated with the class of '41 and graduated with the class of '42.)

#### Maj. William S. McCauley, AUS

Died in Austria on Dec. 20, 1944, from wounds received while he was the commanding officer of C Troop, 4th Cavalry Reconnaissance Squadron, at Bogheim, Germany.

## Capt. Dan J. Morton, AUS

Killed in action in France on July 28, 1944, during the attack on Ville-

A member of the Army Transport Service, he was killed off the coast of Italy in a shipboard explosion on Oct. 15, 1944.

#### 2Lt. James F. Searcy, USA

Killed in action on Sept. 1, 1943, in the Southwest Pacific.

# Lt. Joseph A. Sosbee, Jr., USCG

A member of the U.S. Coast Guard and Geodetic Survey, he was killed in the line of duty in the Aleutians on July 18, 1943, when the Coast Guard amphibian plane in which he was riding crashed into a mountain in a heavy fog.

## 1Lt. Augustus R. Spencer, AUS

Killed in action in Italy on Nov. 4, 1943.

# 1Lt. George H. Steed, Jr., USAAC

Killed in action on Feb. 8, 1945.

#### Lt. Joseph R. Swetting, Jr., USAAC

Lost in a test flight over New Guinea on Aug. 16, 1944.

# Capt. Paul J. Thomson, Jr., USMC

Killed in action on Saipan on June 16, 1944.

# 2Lt. Thomas L. Thrasher, Jr., USAAC

A flight instructor in the Army Air Corps, he was killed in the crash of an Army bomber near Lubbock, Texas, on June 5, 1942.

## Lt. Norman R. Turpin, AUS

Killed in action on Negros Island in The Philippines on July 14, 1945.

#### 2Lt. John R. Banks, USA

Killed in action on Oct. 8, 1943, in Italy.

#### Capt. Alfred P. Goddin, Jr., USA

Killed in action on April 1, 1945, on Luzon.

# 2Lt. Robert L. Guy, USAAF

Killed in action on Nov. 2, 1943, over Rabaul, New Britain.

## 2Lt. Louis A. Heindl, Jr., USAAF

Killed in an airplane accident in Orlando, Florida, on Sept. 19, 1943.

#### Lt. Shirley T. Holland, Jr., USAAF

Missing in action over Burma on Sept. 18, 1944; declared killed in action on Feb. 21, 1946.

#### 1Lt. Meriwether Jones, USAAC

A B-24 pilot, he was killed in action on April 21, 1944, over Bucharest, Rumania, at the conclusion of a bombing run on the rail marshalling yards. When his formation was attacked by about 45 enemy fighters his aircraft was badly damaged and on fire. Jones gave his crew the order to abandon ship and tried to affect a safe landing; he was killed by the force of the crash of his plane.

# Capt. Everett G. King, USAAF

Killed in action on Aug. 15, 1944, he was last seen when pursuing two German Messerschmitts. He was shot down over the small French town of Evereaux-Paris and was buried there by the local priest. King was a flight commander and P-47 pilot, as was his twin brother, Edwin V. King '42.

# 1Lt. Robert A. Lewis, USA

Killed in action in Germany on Sept. 20, 1944.

# Lt. George A. Massenburg, Jr., USN

Declared missing in action in the Saipan area of the Pacific on July 13, 1944; declared killed in action on Jan. 19, 1946.

# 2Lt. John K. McCullough, USAAC

Died on May 8, 1943, when his plane crashed in the South Pacific after he had been overseas for about six weeks.

# 1Lt. David R. Oakey, USAAF

Died on Nov. 18, 1943, in an airplane crash near Glenwood Springs, Colorado.

# Lt. Manley O. Simpson, Jr., USA

Killed in action on Okinawa on May 6, 1945.

# 1Lt. Robert D. Wall, USA

Killed in action on Luzon on Feb. 25, 1945.

A P-38 pilot, he was killed in action on June 12, 1943, over North Africa.

Killed in action on April 17, 1945, in Germany.

Killed in action in France on June 6, 1944. He was with the 29th Division and was buried somewhere on French soil.

# 2Lt. Robert T. Lemmon, Jr., USA

Declared missing in action in France on Aug. 15, 1944; declared killed in action on Dec. 4, 1944. (Lemmon matriculated with the class of '42 and graduated with the class of '43.)

# 2Lt. W. Dow Markin, USA

Killed in action on Dec. 20, 1944, in Belgium.

# 2Lt. Harry L. Smith, Jr., USA

Killed in action on July 1, 1944, in Italy.

Died on Mar. 27, 1946, in an airplane crash in Germany.

Killed in action on June 5, 1944, in an airplane crash.
