Presented to the 1st Class cadet who is declared to be first in Civil Engineering for all four years.

BRIGADIER GENERAL JEFFREY G. SMITH JR. 1979 CYBER MEDAL

Presented to a cadet for excellence in cyberspace and national security studies.

STEWART W. ANDERSON 1908 MEMORIAL AWARD

Presented to the top 1st Class cadet for superior academic performance in the Electrical and Computer Engineering curriculum.

THE JOHN W. AND JANE M. ROBERTS AWARD

Established in honor of John W. and Jane M. Roberts to recognize their lifelong interest in the American free enterprise system and their support for the Department of Economics and Business, this medal recognizes outstanding performance by a 1st Class cadet in the Economics and Business major.

LIEUTENANT RANDOLPH T. TOWNSEND AWARD

Presented to the top-standing 1st Class cadet in the History curriculum.

THOMAS S. BAUR 1975 AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN EXERCISE SCIENCE

Presented to a deserving cadet pursuing the Exercise Science minor, evidenced by academic excellence, research, and physical fitness.

BRUCE C. GOTTWALD JR. 1981 AWARD

Presented to a 1st Class cadet Psychology major who has demonstrated the highest achievement in scholarship, service, and scientific inquiry.

ADOLFO PONZANELLI AWARD

Presented to a 1st Class cadet for excellence in the study of Modern Languages and Cultures.

CHARLES R. MARTIN 1955 AWARD

Presented to a 1st Class cadet accepting a regular commission who has demonstrated excellence in military studies and outstanding leadership in the Corps of Cadets.

THE WILBUR S. HINMAN JR. 1926 RESEARCH AWARDS

Named for the first president of the VMI Research Laboratories, the Hinman Award was created by the directors of the VMIRL to recognize superior achievement by cadets in the performance of research and to recognize faculty sponsors' efforts to encourage cadet participation in such research.

SIR MOSES EZEKIEL AWARD

Presented to a cadet who has contributed to the cultural life of the Institute.

COLONEL HERBERT NASH DILLARD 1934 AWARD

Presented to a 1st Class cadet best emulating Colonel Dillard's scholarship and dedication to a broad liberal arts education.

THE ASA S. DEARING AWARD

Awarded to a 1st Class English major who has demonstrated the highest proficiency in the study of English and English Literature.

THE NATHANIEL W. PENDLETON 1922 DISTINGUISHED COACHING AWARD

Established by Mr. Nathaniel W. Pendleton Jr. '57 in memory of his father, Nathaniel Willis Pendleton, VMI Class of 1922, this award recognizes and encourages excellence in athletic coaching at VMI.

THE VMI DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARDS

The VMI Distinguished Service Awards recognize and encourage excellence and dedication in service to the Virginia Military Institute. The program was endowed in the VMI Foundation, Inc. in 1980 through the VMI Campaign, with an inaugural matching gift from Robert G. Cabell III and the Maude Morgan Cabell Foundation.

THE DR. D. RAE CARPENTER AWARD

Established to honor Dr. D. Rae Carpenter's service to the VMI Research Laboratories, this award is given to the best research proposal that is submitted to the VMI Research Committee.

THE THOMAS JEFFERSON TEACHING AWARD

Initiated by the Robert Earl McConnell Foundation in 1984, the Thomas Jefferson Teaching Award is intended as a tribute to teachers who profoundly influenced and encouraged Jefferson during his own college years. The award is presented annually to a member of the VMI faculty who is beginning a career in academics and who is deemed especially talented at inspiring students in the development of their intellect and character.

THE VMI DISTINGUISHED TEACHING AWARD

The VMI Distinguished Teaching Award recognizes outstanding teaching and academic mentorship by a member of the VMI faculty. The program was endowed in the VMI Foundation Inc. in 1980 through the VMI Campaign, with an inaugural matching gift from Robert G. Cabell III and the Maude Morgan Cabell Foundation.

THE JACKSON-HOPE VMIRL MATTHEW FONTAINE MAURY PRIZE FOR EXCELLENCE IN RESEARCH

Presented to a member of the faculty who has demonstrated a consistent commitment to scholarly work over time. This prize recognizes excellence in stimulating, furthering, or performing research.

THE JACKSON-HOPE PRIZES FOR EXCELLENCE IN PUBLISHED SCHOLARLY WORK

These awards were established to recognize members of the faculty each year for outstanding publications. These prizes recognize publications in any media and may include books, novels, articles, stories, papers, and reports, as well as artistic presentations.

THE JACKSON-HOPE PRIZE FOR EXCELLENCE IN ACADEMIC ADVANCEMENT

Presented to a member of the faculty or academic program staff whose efforts bring renown to the Institute and its programs.

INSTITUTE PROFESSORSHIPS AND CHAIRS

Under the auspices of the General J.H. Binford Peay III 1962 Endowment for Academic Excellence, the Institute Professorships and Chairs Program recognizes outstanding accomplishments by those members of the VMI faculty whose achievements in the classroom, in curriculum and course development, in published scholarly research, and in service to the college and the community set them apart from their colleagues.

THE BENJAMIN H. POWELL JR. 1936 INSTITUTE PROFESSORSHIP IN ENGINEERING

Established by Mr. Powell and the Brown Foundation of Houston, Texas, The Benjamin H. Powell Jr., 1936 Professorship in Engineering recognizes an exemplary member of the engineering faculty.

GENERAL EDWIN COX 1920 INSTITUTE PROFESSORSHIP IN HISTORY AND ECONOMICS

An interdisciplinary chair, the General Edwin Cox 1920 Institute Professorship in History and Economics was established in 1981 to promote the study, research, and teaching of economic systems, with emphasis on the American free enterprise system.

CHARLES S. LUCK JR., 1920 INSTITUTE PROFESSORSHIP IN ENGINEERING

Established by Mrs. Charles S. Luck Jr. in 1983, the Charles S. Luck Jr., 1920 Professorship in Engineering recognizes an exemplary member of the engineering faculty.

JOHN C. ALLEN 1962 DISTINGUISHED PROFESSORSHIP IN CHEMISTRY

The John C. Allen 1962 Distinguished Professorship in Chemistry was established by Mr. Allen in 1998 to honor long-time professors who have dedicated their professional careers to the education of VMI cadets.

HENRY KING BURGWYN JR., BOY COLONEL OF THE CONFEDERACY, CHAIR OF MILITARY HISTORY

The Henry King Burgwyn Jr., Boy Colonel of the Confederacy, Chair in Military History was established in 1996 by the bequest of Dr. Collinson Pierrepont Edwards Burgwyn Sr., of Newport News, Virginia.

COLONEL BEVERLY M. READ 1941 INSTITUTE PROFESSORSHIP IN ARTS AND SCIENCES

An anonymous donor established the Colonel Beverly M. Read 1941 Professorship in Arts and Sciences in 2002 to recognize an exemplary member of the faculty in any department of the liberal arts and sciences at VMI.

JACKSON-HOPE DISTINGUISHED CHAIR IN NATURAL SCIENCES

The Jackson-Hope Distinguished Chairs were established in recognition of the interests of the Jackson-Hope Fund in promoting academic excellence and the needs of VMI in recruiting, developing, and retaining exceptional faculty.
