Information related to disclosure of your Social Security number to the Virginia Military Institute

Section 483 of the Higher Education Act of 1965 grants authority to the United States Department of Education to collect the Social Security numbers of you and your parents on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). In accordance with federal law, disclosure of your Social Security number to VMI is voluntary.

If provided, however, your Social Security number may be used by VMI as permitted under appropriate Federal and state laws and guidelines. Providing your Social Security number to VMI will facilitate the prompt, efficient, and accurate processing of any application for financial aid, will permit the provision of other services, and will allow the compilation of information that is necessary to maintain accurate records. Use of a Social Security number as a student identifier will allow VMI to comply with Federal and state requirements and other guidelines and to avoid duplication of records.
